Accidents

and Refunds: Accidents – in accordance with rule 3222. Refunds – only in the event of a death of an immediate family member.

Test Level/Age: Test level and age are as of the deadline of May 1, 2008. Skaters that test after submitting their Entry Form must notify the competition committee to revise their entry. Skaters have the option of skating up one level except in the Challenge Cup events – Pre-Juvenile FS, Juvenile FS, Open Juvenile FS, Intermediate FS and Novice FS. In Free skating events, skater must choose to skate in free skate or restricted free skate event but not both.

Rink: The ice surface is 85' by 200'.

Music: Only 1 program per Cassette tapes or CD. All tapes should be rewound and ready to play. CD's should have no paper labels. All tapes and CD's should be clearly marked. Please bring a duplicate.

Judging: The ISU Judging System (IJS) will be used for Juvenile through Senior Freestyle and Short Program Events. Skaters competing in IJS events must submit a Planned Program Content for with their application.

Governing

Rules: All competition events will be governed by the 2008-2009 U.S. Figure Skating Rulebook.

Awards: Medals will be awarded to 1st, 2nd, 3rd and 4th place winners. Trophies will be awarded to: The Club scoring the highest number of total points in FS events only (scoring will be 6 points for 1st, 4 points for 2nd, 2 points for 3rd and 1 point for 4th — host club is excluded from this award); and to the U.S. Figure Skating registered High School team scoring the highest number of points in FS, Short program and HS Team maneuver events. Skaters need not medal in their events. 1st, 2nd and 3rd place teams for Theatre on Ice/Choreographic Exercise winners will receive individual medals. Challenge Cups will be awarded to the Champion in the Final round of each Challenge Cup Event (Pre-Juvenile, Juvenile, Intermediate and Novice FS). Skaters who exhibit and skate against the book will receive a medal.

Critique: All Short programs and Freestyle programs for Juvenile, Intermediate, Novice, Junior and Senior as well as Theatre on Ice Teams will be critiqued immediately following their events. Please note area when completing entry form. See additional information in announcement under "Individualized Skater Development Evaluation."

Exhibitions: If only one skater is entered in an event, skater may be asked to skate up one level or consider skating as an exhibition. Exhibitions will be offered to those who are juvenile level and above. Any skater electing to exhibit will forfeit his/her fee for that event. Skaters will be permitted to exhibit one program only. The Referee will designate the day and time for this event. Any skater electing to exhibit needs to skate at the level entered.

Practice Ice: Competition information will be posted on the NSSC and NEICC website approximately 2 weeks prior to the competition. Confirmations, practice ice and directions will not be mailed but can be found on our web site at www.nsskating.net approximately 2 weeks before the competition. PLEASE DO NOT CALL FOR THE SCHEDULE.

SHOWCASE

The eligibility rules as well as the time limits are the same as for free skating events. Showcase levels will be as follows: Pre-Preliminary, Preliminary, Pre-Juvenile, Juvenile, Intermediate, and Adult. Skating up one test level is permitted. Only hand held props are allowed. Males and females may be combined to accommodate all entrants at the discretion of the competition committee. Please include both your "Theme" and name of your "Music" selection on the entry form. Skaters will be judged on the following: Originality, Technical Merit, Costume, Choreography and Audience Appeal. This is a qualifying event for National Showcase 2008: A Competition in Theatrical Skating – Singles competitors who place 1st through 4th in a singles artistic event may qualify for National Showcase 2008. Eligible skaters will have placed 1st through 4th as previously described and will have passed the Preliminary Free Skating test and above OR completed requirements for Adult Interpretive Free Skating and above. Individualized Skater Development Evaluation – "Critique"

In the tradition established by North Shore Open, free skating, restricted free skating and short program events, Juvenile (Adult Silver) and higher* will have a designated, experienced, high-level official assigned to the panel for developing constructive feedback to the skater, professional and/or parents. The referee plans to assign officials to act as evaluators. Following the posting of marks for the event, the designated official will meet one-on-one to review the technical marks, choreography, jumps, spins and the appropriateness of music and costume. This is intended to be a skater development opportunity and participation is entirely voluntary. Advance registration is required on the competition entry form. Evaluations will immediately follow the event in a designated quiet area. Walk-in registration is at the discretion of the host club and referee.

**Challenge Cup competitors will be evaluated after their qualifying event, not after the final round.*

INDIVIDUAL COMPULSORY MOVES AND HIGH SCHOOL MANEUVERS

For Individual compulsory Moves, the eligibility rules of the corresponding Free Skating level apply to this event. Skating up one level is allowed but not below. The time limit for Juvenile and Preliminary is 1 ½ minutes and 2 minutes for Elite, but may be shorter. Half ice will be skated for Juvenile and Preliminary Individuals Compulsory Moves. Elite Individual and High School team maneuvers will utilize the entire ice surface. High School Teams may consist of 3 to 5 skaters, with no one skater performing more than two of the required elements.

Juvenile 1. Axel. 2. Jump Combination – two single jumps – No step or turn between jumps and not to include axel. 3. Stag Jump. 4. Sit Spin. 5. Combination spin – one change of foot, one change of position. 6. LBP power 3 turns in one complete circle.

Preliminary 1. RFI to LFI Spiral. 2. Salchow Jump. 3. Loop Jump. 4. Waltz Jump/toe loop combination – No step or turn between elements. 5. Scratch Spin.

High School Team

Maneuvers 1. Flying Camel Spin. 2. Sit Spin. 3. Axel. 4. Jump Combination consisting of any double jump and any single jump. 5. Circular Step Sequence. One team per High School Club.

COMPULSORY SPIN COMPETITION

No music will be played for this event. Each element may only be performed one time and only stroking and edging necessary to prepare for the element will be allowed. The elements may be performed in any order. Test qualifications are the same as the free skate events. All levels will be competed on half ice. DEDUCTION of .1 WILL BE MADE FOR EACH JUMPS PERFORMED. Ladies and men may be grouped together.

COMPULSORY JUMP COMPETITION

No music will be played for this event. Pre-Preliminary through Juvenile will skate on ½ ice. Intermediate through Senior will skate on full ice. Skater may attempt the jump elements once. Only stroking and edging necessary to prepare for the jump will be allowed. The elements may be performed in any order. Test qualifications are the same as the free skate events. DEDUCTION of .1 WILL BE MADE FOR EACH ADDITIONAL ITEM PERFORMED. Ladies and men may be grouped together.

TEAM COMPULSORY MOVES

Five compulsory moves will be required of each team. The team will consist of 3-5 skaters with no skater executing more than two moves. A skater may not compete for more than one team in an event. The event will be judged on a team basis only. A team may consist of any combination of boys and girls. A club may enter up to three teams in each division, designating each team with different names. The home club of the majority of the team members determines the home club entering the team. Eligibility rules of the corresponding Free Skate level apply to all team compulsory events. Competitors may skate one test level higher.

SCENERY Props may be placed at the designated prop door (zamboni entrance), but all scenery must be placed on the ice and taken off the ice by the skaters and not by any adult/non-team member(s). Scenery may not be brought in to the rink facility until 1 hour prior to the event.

CURTAIN PLEASE NOTE: The club does not install a curtain for this event. Please plan accordingly.

JUDGING The marks will be on a scale of 0 to 6 and ordinals will be calculated in accordance with the USFS rulebook as well as the above-mentioned Theatre on Ice Rules. All judges will be USFS judges that have been trained as Theatre on Ice judges. Critiques will be offered after the event.

DESCRIPTION We request that a description of your team's performance be included with your application for inclusion in the program book. This description may also be included on your CD or tape, and must be no longer than 30 seconds in length (in accordance with the Theatre on Ice Rules mentioned above).
